Listed Buildings



Dawley Hamlets has a number of listed buildings; arguably the best known of these is The Aqueduct, (situated near to where Silkin Way crosses Chapel Lane, Aqueduct Village), which is presently feeling a little neglected but has received structural surveys with a view to the possibility of obtaining grants for its renovation.

At the time of going to press it is is understood that the Borough Council has held a meeting with local residents of Aqueduct, but Dawley Hamlets Parish Council has not been informed of the content or results of the meeting.

It is hoped that the Parish Council will be kept informed at some point in time as there are grave concerns over the future of this historically significant bridge.

The edifice is described on the British Listed Buildings website as a

"Canal aqueduct now a footpath bridge. Circa 1788 by William Reynolds engineer for the Shropshire Canal Navigation. Sandstone ashlar. Single elliptical arch with ashlar arch ring and abutments on either side in deep cutting for the track below. The canal above has been filled in and is now a footpath (Silkin Way). [Correction: the footpath is near the Silkin Way but not part of it]. Note: The Shropshire Canal was a tub boat [canal] authorised in June 1788 from Wrockwardine Wood to Coalport on the River Severn. It was converted to a railway line in 1857-61.

The Consequences of War

As my thoughts turn to the Anniversary of my Dad's birth it reminds me that this year also sees us remember the outbreak of the Great War in 1914.

Dad was born in County Limerick, Ireland towards the end of the 19th century. He was born into a family who served Crown and country, his father being a member of the RIC. Two of his brothers also served in the RIC. On the outbreak of WW1 one of them transferred to the British Army and served in Mesopotamia. He was discharged from the Army because of horrendous injuries he received and after hospitalisation in Basra he was declared unfit to serve. Dad on the other hand served in France and saw service in the Somme. History tells us that young men were quickly propelled into officer roles and so it was with Dad. Indeed in March 1918 he was commissioned as an officer in the regular army for the Cheshire Regiment and served at Cannock Chase.

Here was a young man ordering troops into unspeakable situations. The carnage of war lived with him all his life. As a young child I remember crying in bed because of my Dad's screams coming from my parents' bedroom. I was born in 1941. It was after my Dad's death in the 1970s that my eldest sister told me that Dad suffered nightmares throughout his life because of what he witnessed during WW1.

I was brought up in a very loving and happy home in which love served all of us. Now in my 70s I reflect on my mum's role in caring for us all and in particular the loving way in which she dealt with dad's nightmares. At the time there was very little help available to combat the stresses in the lives of ex service personnel. In many cases, such as Dad's, men and their families had to simply grin and bear it. Even less was available to people like Dad because they returned to their homeland. Now what happened to Dad is not unique. I have no doubt that countless families throughout the realm can relate to what I am saying about the consequences of war.

Nowadays there are numerous charities who support our former service personnel. Each has a unique role in the rehabilitation and care of our former service personnel. Each and every one of the charities deserves our support. So this year try and give just a little more to the charities. Your support does not have to be financial, sometimes just a cheery wave will do, or clearing litter from a garden. Above all we must each strive for peace. No I, alone, cannot change the various conflicts in our world, what I can influence is peace in my own heart and then in my family, amongst my friends, then in my neighbourhood. Can you try for such peace in your life?


Up to date minutes are usually placed on the web site within days of them being approved, by Council, as a true record of the proceedings. http://dawley-hamlets.org
